Success Story:

Empowering SMART Girls with Confidence & Self-Care

SMART Girls is one of the Boys & Girls Clubs' most impactful and cherished programs. The program's curriculum is designed to deliver the right information and support at the right time, offering tailored modules for three distinct age groups: 8 to 10, 11 to 13, and 14 to 18. These age-appropriate sessions ensure that each girl receives the guidance she needs to grow into a confident, empowered young woman.

The SMART (Skills Mastery And Resistance Training) Girls program took a meaningful step in supporting the personal development of our 3rd - 6th grade participants by distributing hygiene bags. This initiative was aimed at promoting positive personal care habits and boosting the girls' self-esteem by equipping them with essential tools and knowledge.

The purpose behind the distribution of hygiene bags is to:

- **Encourage Positive Hygiene Practices:** By providing essential tools, we are helping the girls establish good habits that will last a lifetime.
- **Build Self-Esteem:** Items were carefully selected to empower the girls, helping them take pride in their personal care and boosting their confidence.
- **Create a Sense of Community and Inclusion:** The hygiene bags not only provided essential items but also fostered a sense of support and care within the SMART Girls community.

Through small-group sessions, discussions, hands-on activities, role-play, and collaborative problem-solving, each girl is encouraged to express her individuality while also learning important life skills.

We are excited to see the positive impact of this initiative as the girls continue to grow, learn, and develop into strong leaders in their communities.





Success Story:

Inspiring the Next Generation at College Night

Keystone Club (our Teen Leadership Program) hosted an inspiring College Night event that provided our high school students with an invaluable opportunity to connect with college freshmen and gain firsthand insights into college life. We welcomed a panel of five college students from prestigious universities including Brown University, San Diego State, UC Berkeley, and Cal State Long Beach. Many of these college students were former Keystone members themselves, making their stories all the more relatable for our current members.

The event was designed to foster meaningful conversations and give high school students the chance to ask questions and learn about the realities of college life. In small-group sessions, the high school students had the opportunity to connect directly with the college students and ask questions about topics ranging from homesickness and dealing with roommates to managing academic accountability and finding the balance between work and play. Topics like transportation, finding part-time

jobs, and adjusting to the freedom and responsibility that comes with college were also discussed.

The response from our high school students, especially seniors, was overwhelmingly positive. **Many expressed how valuable it was to hear about the college experience from people they could relate to** — former Keystone members who had walked the same path and faced the same challenges. The conversations were not only educational but also motivational, as the college students shared their personal journeys, including how the Keystone Club helped shape their leadership skills and set them on a path toward success.

For our current Keystone members, this College Night served as a reminder that higher education is within reach and that their dreams are achievable.

This College Night was just one example of how the Keystone Club continues to provide opportunities for our youth to connect, grow, and strive for their future goals.

Total Teen Takeover

With the Total Teen Takeover Initiative in mind, BGCMCC focused a lot of efforts on recruiting and retaining teen members. Total Teen Takeover is an ongoing BGCA wide Teen & Tween Recruitment & Engagement Strategy that **aims to provide high quality and engaging programs, provide safe and appealing spaces where teens feel ownership & agency, and inspire tweens & teens to engage, not just in the clubs but in their communities.**

We continued the **Stollmeyer STEAM Challenge** distributing up to \$10,000 in scholarships to our Club teens. Eligible applicants participated in one or more series of the Stollmeyer STEAM challenge.

Each series consisted of 6 categorized sessions in Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math, and a Career Launch Module. Along with completing the series, candidates also had to volunteer hours to club and community and complete an essay on the importance of STEAM disciplines in our community.

BGCMCC awarded eight \$1,000 awards to high schoolers and two \$500 awards to middle school students.



Keystone Club is BGCA's leadership club for teens ages 14-18, focused on Character & Leadership, Service to Club & Community, and Education & Career Exploration. This year, BGCMCC had the opportunity to send ten members to partake in the **57th Annual Keystone Conference, held in Atlanta, Georgia.**

One of the biggest takeaways was **members getting a chance to travel to a different part of the United States and meeting so many people of diverse backgrounds.** Another sentiment was on how united their generation was on various topics and community needs. Our Members also had an opportunity to attend classes on topics of their choosing and culminated in a community service project of building skateboards for young children in foster care.

Our Keystone and STEAM Leadership members hosted a college and career night, **“Dinner with a Young Professional.”** This was a speed networking event with young professionals who have recently graduated from their university and are now working their first job. Our local young professionals were students not so long ago from both Santa Maria High School and Pioneer Valley High School with university representation from Cal Poly, San Diego State, UC Riverside, and UCLA. Our club member youth along with other invited high school students participated in a speed networking style event where they rotated and visited with each of our professionals to ask about **tips for landing their first job, navigating college resources, and what to expect for life after graduation.**

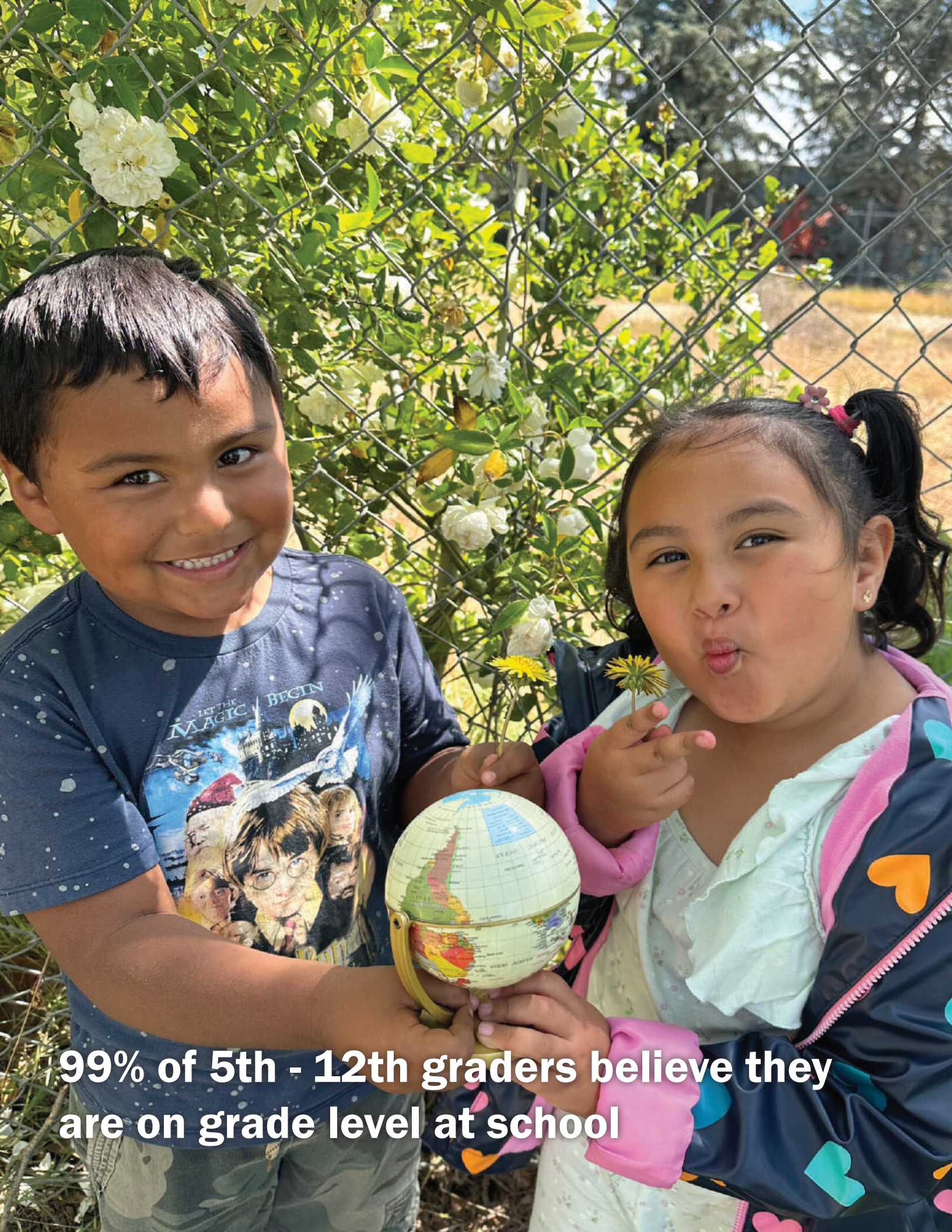


BGCMCC selected **Abraham Carrillo Galindo** to represent our organization at our **Coastal Area Council Youth of the Year** competition.

It is the highest honor a Boys & Girls Club member can receive.

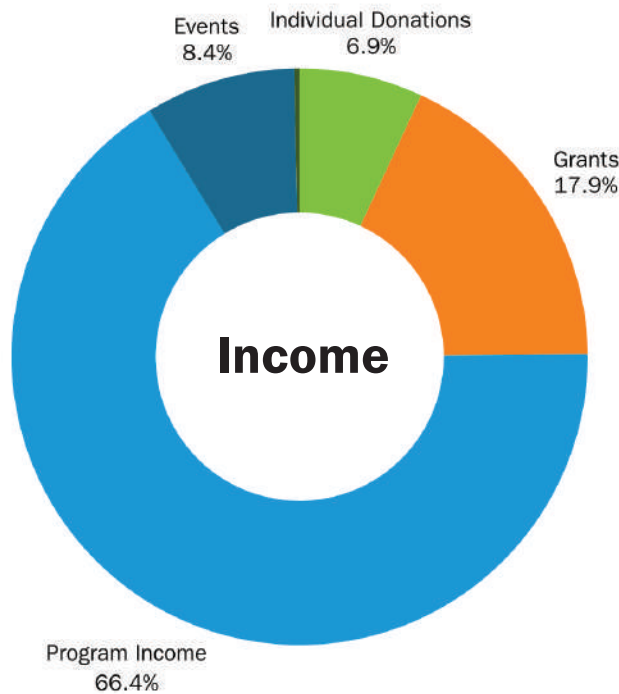

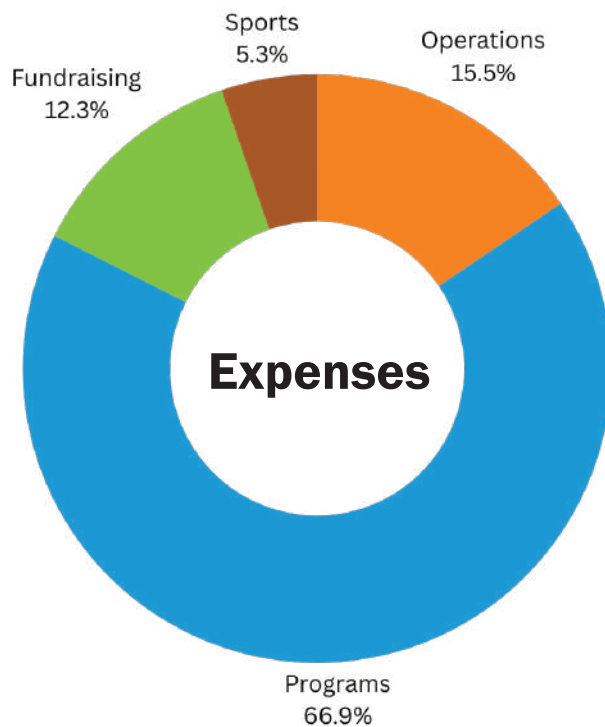


99% of 5th - 12th graders believe they are on grade level at school
