Dear Friends and Supporters,

2025 was a year of momentum and focus as we leaned into a clear commitment to be better, bigger, and bolder on behalf of the youth we serve.

Across 10 Club sites in two counties, we served more than 4,000 youth, creating safe, supportive environments where young people can learn, grow, and build a strong foundation for their future.

This year, we listened closely. Through our Community Listening Tour, families, youth, and community partners helped us better understand both the needs and opportunities in our region. What we heard was clear. Access matters. Quality matters. Connection matters.

We took action.

Transportation was one of the most immediate barriers facing families. In response, we expanded our fleet of buses and vans, increasing access so more youth can consistently participate in our programs.

We also clarified our growth priorities, focusing on expanding school partnerships, strengthening program quality, and positioning the organization for long-term impact. This includes advancing future opportunities that will allow us to serve more youth at a higher level.

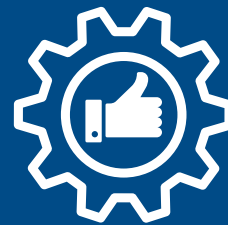

Club Success Story:

Removing Barriers, Expanding Opportunity

Boys & Girls Clubs of Mid Central Coast (BGMCC) and Paso Robles Joint Unified School District (PRJUSD) formalized a three-year partnership to expand after-school programming at the Tom Maas Clubhouse, ensuring local families continue to have access to affordable, high-quality youth services.

When PRJUSD reduced its transportation services, however, hundreds of families faced an unexpected barrier. Without reliable transportation, many young people risked losing access to safe supervision, academic support, enrichment opportunities, and the positive relationships that help them thrive. For working parents, the challenge extended beyond after-school care—it threatened their ability to balance employment and family responsibilities.

Recognizing that access to quality programming depends on access to transportation, BGMCC responded by providing transportation for Club members from elementary and middle schools across the district, including Georgia Brown, Winifred Pifer, Kermit King, Virginia Peterson, Glen Speck, and Lewis Flamson Junior High. By removing one of the greatest barriers to participation, the organization ensured that hundreds of youth could continue attending after-school programs regardless of their family's transportation resources.

To make this possible, BGMCC absorbed the additional transportation costs, increasing its budget by nearly 30 percent, and invested in additional vans to sustain the service for years to come.

This was more than a transportation solution; it was a commitment to access, equity, and opportunity. Rather than allowing families to lose critical services, BGMCC chose to meet the need.

That commitment was recognized by the SLO County Community Foundation, which awarded BGMCC a \$75,000 grant to help sustain transportation services and keep young people connected to opportunity.

Because when barriers are removed, opportunity expands, and when opportunity is accessible, young people, families, and communities thrive.



Club Success Story:

Listening to Learn, Sharing to Strengthen, Acting for Impact

Strong organizations do not plan for their communities. They plan with them.

In 2025, Boys & Girls Clubs of Mid Central Coast launched a Community Listening Tour across Northern San Luis Obispo County and Northern Santa Barbara County to ensure its strategic plan reflected the voices of those it serves. Guided by three principles—Learn, Share, and Act—the initiative brought together more than 80 educators, government leaders, nonprofit partners, business leaders, and community advocates representing 30 organizations.

Organizational leadership visited each of the seven communities served by BGCMCC—Shandon, Creston, Atascadero, Paso Robles, Santa Maria, Guadalupe, and Orcutt—to better understand the opportunities, challenges, and evolving needs facing youth and families.

While each conversation reflected the unique character of its community, common priorities quickly emerged: expanding access to safe spaces, mental health resources, career exploration, family support, and stronger collaboration among organizations serving young people. The message was clear—lasting impact requires collective action.

These insights became the foundation of BGCMCC's strategic planning process, helping organizational leadership and the Board of Directors clarify priorities, align resources, and establish a community-informed roadmap for the future. More than a planning exercise, the Listening Tour strengthened relationships across the region and reinforced a shared commitment to improving outcomes for children and families. By listening first, sharing openly, and acting intentionally, BGCMCC continues to build partnerships that expand opportunities and ensure every young person has the support they need to reach their full potential.





Teen Triumphs

In 2025, Boys & Girls Clubs of Mid Central Coast served 497 teens and young adults ages 13-18. Our Teen Programs include Money Matters, CareerLaunch, Keystone Club, Torch Club and our Youth of the Year initiative. Here are a few of the highlights from our Teen Programs throughout 2025:



Our Keystone members had the privilege of attending the 58th Annual Keystone Conference. More than 1,300 teens traveled to Chicago for the event.



The first annual “Adulting Day” provided workshops on basic first aid, resume building, cooking, auto knowledge and financial literacy for our Guadalupe teens.



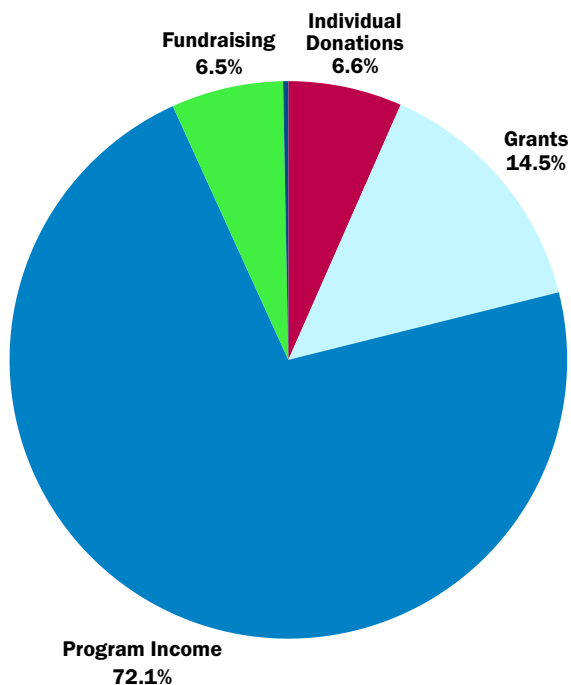
The ‘Meet a Professional’ program hosted several community leaders across different industries, including public safety, law, veterinarian services and health.

2025 Income*

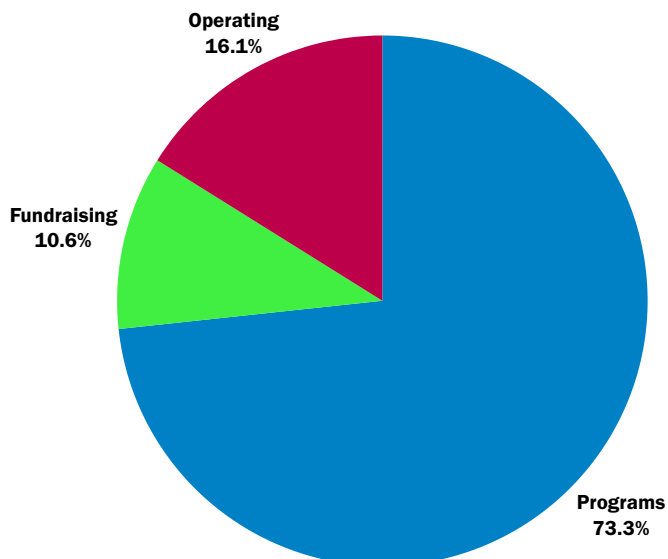

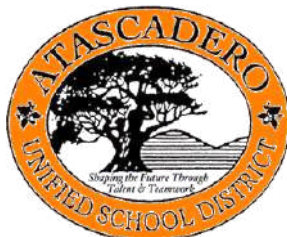
